Requirements to Complete 4-H Year

- Participate in a minimum of 4 of the following: judging, 4-H workshops, 4-H county events. Examples of the county events would be Achievement Days, Horse Show, Public Presentation, Fashion Revue, Special Foods, Shooting Sports, Rodeo Hippology, Quiz Bowl. Achievement Days only counts as 1 event. Maximum of 2 club meetings (must be called to order and have a secretary's report) may count towards the 4; one may include public presentation. Contact club leader to make prior arrangements. If your schedule does not allow you to attend a Roberts County event you may go to another county.
- Showed Project accomplishment. Only need to be enrolled in one project area.
- Give a demonstration/public presentation. This needs to be done either at a club meeting or county contest.
- Minimum of 5 volunteer hours at 4-H events (lunch stands, BBQ, Meatball Dinner etc..)
- 4-H journal completed:
 - "My 4-H Story" completed, parent and 4-H member signature. The Journal is NOT

complete without both signatures

- Static Project, Youth in Action and Livestock sheets completed for projects done.
- Golden Rod 4H Participation Sheet, 4-H Accomplishment Summary (Green Packet), and Current 4-H Journal needs to be turned in to club leader on the September date that was assigned.
- Volunteer hours form completed and signed by an adult other than parent.

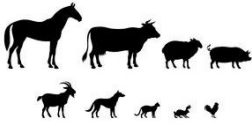
